1. Introduction and Purpose

As a territory, we want to be careful and not fearful during COVID. This is a summary of our Territory's COVID-safe policy. (For explanation see full policy.) Together we can beat COVID-19

2. Scope

Government SOPs should *always* be followed. This policy applies to all officers, Salvationists and employees.

3. Procedure

All persons entering a Salvation Army property MUST wear a mask. Masks must cover both mouth and nose. All individuals must continue to wear a face mask while talking to reduce the possible spread of infection. **The mask should never be pulled down while speaking.** This includes all speaking from the platform, including preaching messages.

Social distancing should apply to all Salvation Army gatherings – indoor or outdoor. For outdoors 1m distance should be maintained. For indoors at least 1.5m distance should be maintained.

THQ will supply a sign which should be displayed at each public entry that specifies the requirement for mask wearing, and the maximum number of people that can be in the space at the same time.

Officers and other managers are invited to be creative about how to operate with these restrictions. For example, some officers may decide to hold the same meeting twice in order for all people to be able to attend one or the other.

No handshaking or hugging should occur, as this does not maintain social distance. Instead, The Salvation Army's salute can be a helpful way of greeting each other.

Photographs of groups assembled together must show people wearing masks.

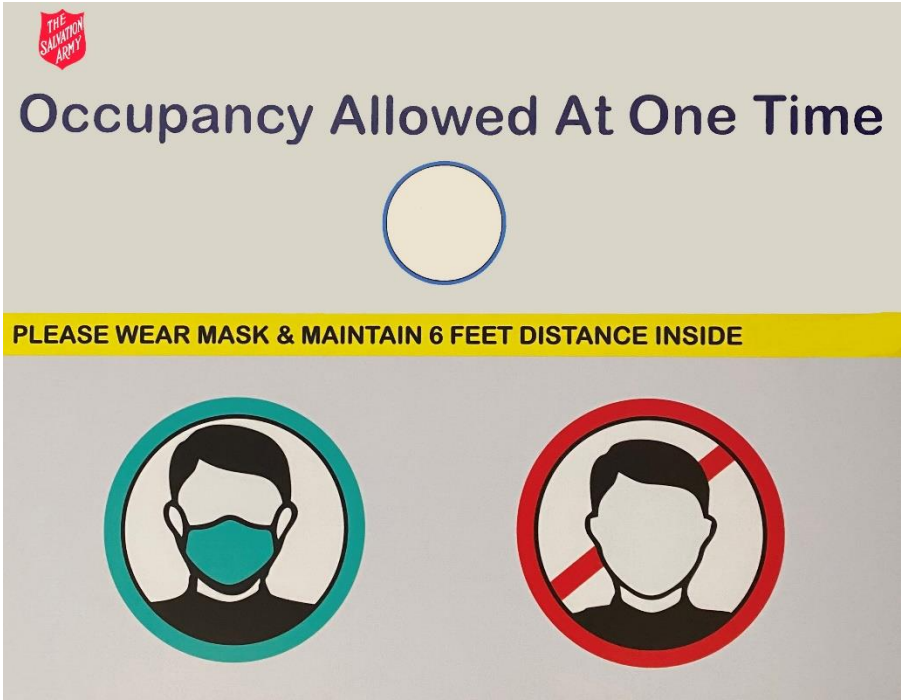
4. Monitoring and Review

The Chief Secretary will be responsible for monitoring and review of this document.

5. Responsibility

It is the responsibility of divisional/district leaders and heads of departments that all officers and Salvationists are aware of the *full* policy. This is a summary for convenience. It is also the responsibility of all personnel to ensure that they understand and implement it. Those who do not adhere to this policy will be followed up through supervision or through formal investigation.

Keep hands Clean
